

From the homilies recently...

Fr. Tom

Three questions...

#1 Do we need Advent? Really?
I like the Advent wreath. I like John the Baptist.
Couldn't we just skip Advent? Would we miss anything? It's a short time. Do you really need the season to celebrate the birth of Jesus?

#2 What about John the Baptist?

I find the guy extremely interesting. He is the miracle child of Elizabeth and Zachariah.

Why did he leave his land and go to the wilderness? Why did he give up everything he had? What called him into the wilderness? Did he hear God's call? The people who were attracted to John the Baptist were the ones who were kicked out of the temple.

#3 What about his message?

Repent. Repent is a change of direction. People who've been in a 12 step program understand repent. It is a whole, turning away and going someplace else. It is a change of life, a change of mind, change of living, a change of priorities.

The real hope of Christmas is that God does not call us to do nothing in our hurting world, but to go more deeply as we strive to work for social justice and peace. How can we honestly be more Christlike in our minds and vision during this Advent and beyond?

We're celebrating Advent. We prepare for Jesus' first coming, and for his coming again as King at the end of the world. He is coming all the time and working through us.

Prepared or not...Christmas is here! May we enjoy our celebrations! God's blessings on all of us and everyone!


Justice Challenge 4nd Week of Advent

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear the angel inviting Mary to become the mother of the Messiah. Mary worried about doing this without breaking her promises to God. The angel replies with the story of Elizabeth being with child even though she was beyond the age of child-bearing. The angel states, "... for nothing will be impossible for God."

Your challenge this week is to bring the Good News of Jesus and his message of possibilities to someone who has been weighed down by darkness or despair—due to illness, financial stress, relationship problems, or whatever. As a family, choose one person—or one family—who needs you to remind them that with God, nothing is impossible. December 24, 2023 4th Sunday of Advent

Life is troubling. Who among us has not struggled with anxiety and difficulties, sometimes massive ones? I certainly have, as have many of my loved ones. If we do, does this mean that we don't trust the Lord or just need to toughen up?

I don't think so. How encouraging for us anxious and troubled souls to hear Luke describe the Blessed Mother Mary in these words, "But she was greatly troubled at what was said." An archangel has visited her. An inconceivable promise has been made to her. Her life has become wildly unpredictable, perhaps more so than any person before or since. The first point for us: the Lord is with her precisely when she is troubled. Her anxiousness and God's presence are not mutually exclusive. Christianity is not about a trance-like robotic indifference. It's about the presence of divine love. Even in — especially in — troubled circumstances.

Our troubled soul can become our greatest treasure. What seems so troubling at first to Mary becomes the best possible thing, Jesus, the Savior and Lord, is now her son. All the difficulties and troubles remain, and yet her movement into the fullness of God is accelerated. What is troubling you right now? This scripture invites us now, this week, to hear the Lord's messenger say to us what he said to Mary, "Do not be afraid! You have found favor with God."


