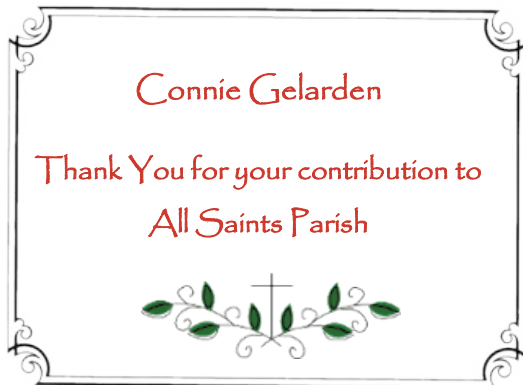

Family Faith Formation will begin using a Gratitude Journal. We will be making a daily entry of what we are grateful for each day. Have you considered using a Gratitude Journal? Completing an Examen each evening? How do you reflect on your day and God's blessings of your day?

This is a version of the five-step Daily Examen that St. Ignatius practiced.

1. Become aware of God's presence.
2. Review the day with gratitude.
3. Pay attention to your emotions.
4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it.
5. Look toward tomorrow.

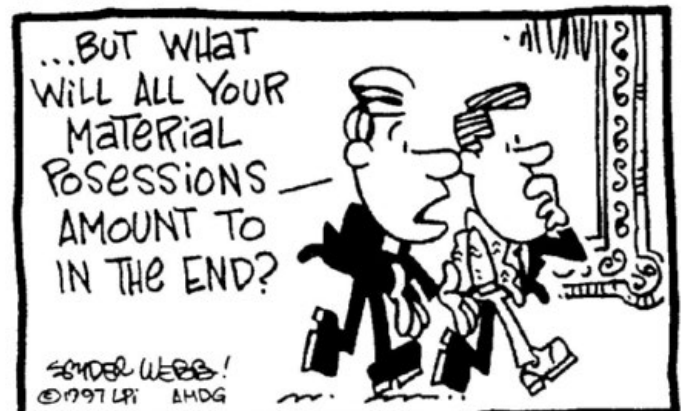
Birthright exists because of your financial and moral support. We are always in need of clothing, bottles, diapers, and wipes for size preemie to size 6T.



Parish Council summary for 1-2-24

Meeting began with prayer.

December meeting minutes were approved.

Commission Reports were submitted.

Updates:

- * Kristi Wagner is our Business Manager/Pastoral Associate.
- * Sharon continues to work to make our St. Joseph Church campus a "No Trespass" campus with the EPD.
- * Sharon met with Bishop Siegel to review the past year. She has been appointed as PLC for another year.
- * New brochures have been printed for endowments. The \$5,000 needed to begin the new All Saints Parish endowment has been secured through a bequest.
- * Fr. Jay will be hosting "A Listening Church" session on March 13 beginning at 6:30 pm in the cafeteria.
- * We hope to begin with our Hand Up ministry by the end of January.
- * Seminarian, Nick Folz, will be working with our Wednesday morning charity/justice ministries this semester.
- * Our annual St. Meinrad Weekend will be on Saturday & Sunday, February 10 & 11, 2024. Fr. Lowell Will will be joining us at all Masses to speak with us about the work of St. Meinrad.
- * The following projects have been completed: replace valves in heat/air in parish office building, cleaned system and put in a filter system for the water loop for heat/air, new phone control box installed, dishwasher replaced in rectory, floor in the Fr. Niehaus room was refinished.

Discussion:

- * Season of Giving – Stewardship has been completed. To date 182 of 317 (57%) of families have responded. \$89,635 of our \$145,907 (61%) Catholic Ministry Appeal has been pledged.
- * We will be having a Parish Mission "God the Holy Spirit is Calling" on January 28, 29 and 30th with three Sisters of St. Benedict leading our Mission.
- * We will be having a Parish Synod "Our Journey Together...Come share what the Holy Spirit is saying to you about All Saints Parish." This will begin in early Lent.

Next meeting begins at 6pm on February 6th.



From the homilies recently...

Fr. Tom

His disciples asked, where are you going? He told them, I will show you. Jesus is not telling them that he's going to teach them theology or catechism or a sermon or a class. He just says come and I will show you. Jesus is saying to them and all of us, if you want to follow me, this is what I do. He's telling the community of All Saints, if you want to follow me, it is about the heart of God. If you want to follow me, we have to pattern our lives so they are centered on Christ, the heart of God.

This is so key in Jesus. Come and see what we do. The most important place in this church is the exit signs. When we leave this church, then we have to live. Now we have to practice following Christ. We leave together, and live the presence of God in our daily living.

We have trouble really listening to what other people are saying. We are used to being in our own thoughts and thinking what we're going to say next.

in the first reading today from the book of the prophet Samuel, we learned about how Samuel learned to listen when God called. Eli would call, Samuel would go and see what he wanted. On this night, Samuel thought it was Eli calling. Eli told him to say, "speak Lord your servant is listening. At this time he begins to learn to listen and hear God speaking.

God speaks to all of us just like he did to Samuel. We need to tune in and listen to what he says. God speaks in many different ways. He's probably not going to speak to you in words, but he's going to speak to you. We need to listen, especially to people who love us and care for us. Listening is the key. We need to listen to one another because God can speak through all kinds of people...people we love, people we don't love, our children, our parents.

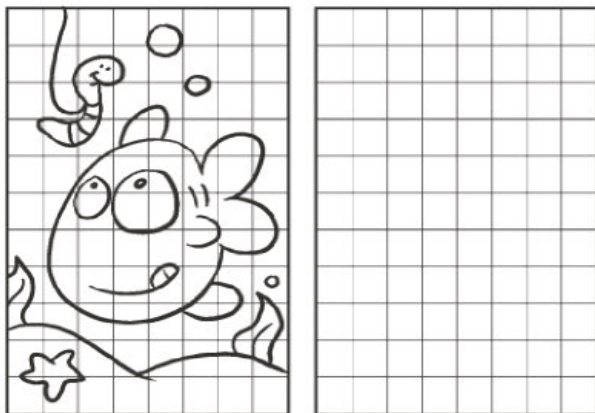

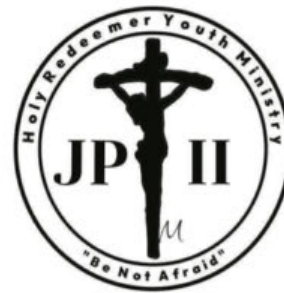
