Family Faith Formation

"Come to Me, all you who labor and are burdened."
Mt. 11:23

People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

In February, Family Faith Formation will begin to learn more about the theme of "Honesty: being trustworthy and true." What does it mean to be honest? The following quote has been attributed to Socrates... "Is it true? Is it kind? Is it necessary (helpful)?" The word helpful comes from one of our lessons. These questions truly help us evaluate what needs to be said and when. To tell the truth if a person is being mean or cruel...is that being a person of integrity? Is that honesty? As you can see, our February lessons are going to have some interesting conversations.



Justice Challenge– 4th Week in Ordinary Time

Very early on in his public career people were spellbound by Jesus' teachings and recognized that there was something unusually powerful about what he was teaching and how he was teaching. The listeners in the synagogue in Capernaum noticed that Jesus was using his power and authority only for good, in this case, to cast out a demon. They noted the contrast with the way the scribes taught and threw around their authority. This week, think about who in your life wields authority and/or speaks persuasively and moves people to action. Now, consider, are those charismatic people using their power for good, or are they using harmful or hateful words or moving people to do harm to others? Identify those voices in your life whom you trust are speaking with the love, compassion, and mercy of Jesus, and listen to them.

*Racial Justice Faith Week thoughts by Brenda Meyer,
Justice Minister All Saints Parish*

I am thinking about what is important to me as I join in communion with others each weekend. Martin Luther King once commented that Sunday is the most segregated day of the week. I am an incredibly pleased every time I sit down and look around either at St. Joseph or St. Anthony that I see a variety of people who join together to celebrate the eucharist. They do not all look like me and thankfully so. Being able to see someone with different skin tones and/or facial features makes me feel I really have come to the table of many. It helps me feel more connected to my community and to the church, which clearly embraces racial groups across the globe. It also makes me aware that I need to listen more to the needs of others and not assume I know how things are for them. Let me join with others, but also help me listen more. Also, it challenges me to be more open to realizing just because someone does not complain, they might not be having an easy time. I've got to learn that at times I have to move from listening and learning to action. This is out of my comfort zone, but recently I have felt I need to voice support for immigrants, those of Asian, Jewish, Palestinian, Middle Eastern, Hispanic, Indian (both from the continent and Native American ones) heritage or anyone who does not look or sound the mythical white American. Since my grandfather immigrated from eastern Germany, I am closer to the immigration issue than I often think. I want to see the humanity in everyone. Respect that we all have the same needs for safety and need to be able to live and flourish wherever we are settled.






Racial Justice Faith Week January 29 through February 4th is set aside for racial justice faith activities.

From the homilies recently...

Fr. Brenner

Many seminarians have spent time with me over the years. One was a reactionary student who once sent off a negative letter to a teacher. He came to me afterwards for help as once you have said something others don't forget. Like Jonah in the first reading. This was the second time God called on Jonah. The first time he ran away and that is the story about the big fish/whale. The second call from God is to again teach the gospel of repentance to the people of Nineveh. He did and this time they did repent.

We also receive messages from God- receive this call. God calls us in many ways. How many of us would be willing to follow Jesus and put down our nets/profession? Look what we do to take care of the community: soup kitchens, clothes closets, community action. How is he calling you?

In the first reading we hear how God told Jonah to go East to Nineveh. Jonah didn't like the people of Nineveh and thought they should be punished for their evil ways so he went West towards the Mediterranean Sea, got in a boat and was swallowed up by a whale.

God then gave Jonah a second chance so Jonah went to Nineveh announcing of the destruction of the city if they didn't change their evil ways. The people of Nineveh heard the voice of God through Jonah and turned their lives around. God did not destroy their city.


When we hear God call us do we resist like Jonah, or do we surrender? Best to surrender to God's will, we will be happier.




