Justice Challenge 6th week in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel is about the leper who touches Jesus' heart. While leprosy isn't rampant in our communities today, many people suffer from the poverty of relationships which lepers suffered in Jesus' time. There are people in our own communities who have no one who loves them except God. And they may not experience God's love because they have no human love to help them recognize God's love. They are the lonely, the alienated; some are scared, or angry or wounded. Your challenge this week is to take the compassion in your heart beyond your immediate circle of loved ones and extend that compassion to someone who is alone. What can you do as a family or household to bring love into this person's live? And can you commit to making it more than a one-time act of kindness and care? How can you continue to let this person know that he or she is not alone in this world, that God loves them, and that you do, too?

Valentine's Day is February 14th. It is a day on which we celebrate love, often by exchanging symbols of our deep feelings for each other. When we think of poverty, we usually think of people without economic resources like food, clothing and shelter. But so many people in the world suffer from a poverty of relationships. They have no one in their lives who loves them except God. And they may not experience God's love because they have no human love to help them recognize God's love. They are the lonely, the alienated; some are scared or angry or wounded. **Your challenge this week** is to take Valentine's Day beyond your immediate circle of loved ones and extend a "valentine" to someone who might not get a single card or any flowers or candy or jewelry from anyone else. What can you do as a family or household to bring love into this person's life? And can you commit to making it more than a one-time act of kindness? How can you continue to let this person know that he or she is not alone in this world, that God loves them and that you do too? ©Center for Ministry Development. 

In the first reading, I have been there in this first reading.

In the Gospel, why didn't Jesus heal everybody? He didn't. How many people pray and pray and pray for healing? Miracles are hard to come by. Where are you Jesus? Where are you God? Are you asleep? Why don't you wake up and help us now?

We probably all know people who have asked us to hold them in prayer. Why are some people's prayers answered and others pray and they don't get anything? Did Jesus go to someone's home who was sick and he didn't heal them? He just comforted them?

Christ's hand can break the fever of death, condemnation, injustice, sorrow and grief, the chains of despair. We all have fevers. How can Jesus remove that fever from us? We are called to use our hands to lift people up as Jesus did.

I do believe that God is with us in our sickness. But I do not believe that God uses sickness to teach us a lesson. I do believe when we pray God hears our prayers. I do believe that God has never left us. We are to ask God to remove our fevers, so that we may live in a hopeful, joyful way.



Sr. Kathryn reminded us that the Jewish name for God/Spirit is Yahweh. The very word was so sacred it wasn't spoken at all but breathed, in the attempt to replicate and imitate the very sound of inhalation and exhalation. Breathe in *Yah*, breathe out *weh*. The one thing we do every moment of our lives is breathe, therefore, we speak the name of God every time we breathe making it our first and last word as we enter and leave the world. So, no matter your nationality, rich or poor we all breathe. The playing field is utterly leveled. No one and no religion can control the Spirit, "it blows where it will." John 3:8

Throughout all of scripture God's mantra is "I am with you, I love you, Trust Me." We need to take time daily in solitude and silence to listen to the Divine voice. The words "Silent" and "Listen" are made of the same letters. How do you listen to God's Divine voice?

Sister T gave her Mission talk Tuesday, January 30 "Catching the Spirit"


She pointed out that we are the only parish in the Diocese with a soup kitchen and that shows how the Spirit is moving in this parish working through our hands and feet.




